
Arab Novel Writing Program (ANWP) 2014-2016

ANWP is a special program launched by AFAC in 2014 to support young Arab authors in bringing their literary ideas to life. Three program cycles allowed AFAC to support a total of 25 emerging authors from 9 countries, selected from 668 applications, to create a safe place to communicate, critic and interact, a forum to deepen themes and elaborate on critical topics, personal, social and
























Sub Themes

Each submitted novel deals with a pressing theme or themes. From all the 668 applications submitted to ANWP over a period of 3 years, we have extrapolated the following sub themes

Daily Life and Personal Stories: Documenting daily life, in its economic, political, social, personal, and cultural dimensions, in its relevance to individuals and society at large.

Identity and Self Discovery: Identity is a core concern for young Arabs authors, as it helps them understand their place and role in society and the world at large.

Romance: Love is the subject of choice for writers and authors in the region and the world at large and is reflected as such in the applicants' pool.

Arab Revolutions and the Arab Spring: This theme picks up on the revolutionary energies that erupted few years back and elaborates on youth's quest for freedom and democracy.

The Past and its Burden: The past is part of our individual and collective memory; how can we make peace with it?

Tyranny, Repression and Torture: Addresses political and social repression and its impact on both the individual and society.

Religion: A dimension that infiltrates almost every aspect of Arab societies, including politics, making it a topic of choice.

Wars and civil wars: Wars, especially civil wars, have divided nations and displaced people in this part of the world, destroying heritage and traditions and disrupting communi-

Change and Rebellion: Overcoming tyranny and oppressive regimes has created spaces for freedom and healing.

Displacement, migration and exile: Wars and political instability, as well as dire social and economic circumstances has forced people to flee their homelands, making this theme

Youth, Challenges, and Ambitions: How does Arab youth navigate the fine line between freedom and the desire to follow one's personal dreams, all within the oppressive and restrictive environment they live in?

14 **Corruption:** Corruption is prevalent in contemporary Arab societies and affects social values and behaviours.

Women's rights: An attempt to give women, especially marginalized ones, a voice in a society that continues to ostracize them

Science Fiction: Imagination is a powerful tool, and Arab writers have been making inroads when it comes to the realms of science fiction.

Social Media: Has changed the way we communicate and stay connected to what's going on in the world, playing a crucial role in the quests of Arab youth.

Homosexuality: It remains one of the big taboos in the region and dealing with it in literature is a complicated issue for young
